

The BTEC Level 1/Level 2 Tech Award in Art and Design Practice is a fantastic vocational course that gives you the knowledge and skills through processes in investigating, exploring and creating art and design work as part of the learning.

The course consists of **three** projects in Year 10 which allow you to develop, practice and hone your creative art and design and research skills.

These units are set in school by your teacher and are based around scenarios that require a response to the brief. These are all assessed internally by the teacher.

In Year 11 there are **two externally set terminal assessment tasks** which tests you on areas that have been covered in previous units. These are **both assessed internally and externally**.

All of the units are completed in a practical environment, alongside a digital portfolio, and you are expected to produce work independently as part of your home learning opportunities.

These are the units that will be covered as part of the course structure to develop practical skills.

The first 3 units are all assessed within school by the teacher.

These are **The Bistro, 3D Sculpture and Architecture & Landmarks**.

The terminal exam units are externally set and constitute the final mark for the course.

These are:

- **Creative Practice in Art and Design 60%**
- **Responding to a Brief 40%**

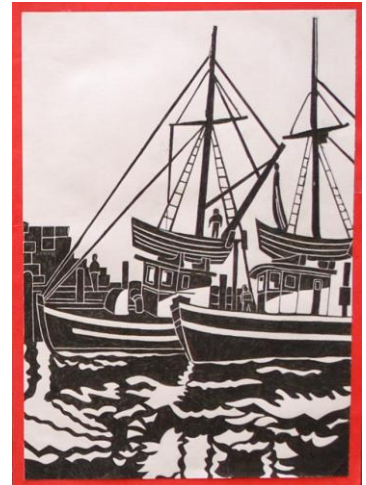

- Evaluate your work

The work for each unit is marked and verified separately and the assessments do not cross over between different projects.

This highlights the importance of working consistently throughout the course and challenging yourself to produce your best in every single lesson.

All of the externally set units are throughout Year 11 so consistency really will pay off.
