Have you tried this one? *Revision Cards*

A guide to using revision cards

1. Revision cards work really well for subjects which require you to learn a lot of content
2. Have a stack of A6 cards cut up ready
3. Challenge yourself to summarise a lot of text onto one side of a revision card
4. Aim to pick out key words/points, use diagrams, charts, flow diagrams etc
5. Highlight the key points so they stand out or use different coloured pens
6. Now test yourself-read the revision card and see how much more detail you can add when you are just looking at the key points
7. This is great for revising with someone at home; they can have the revision card and you tell them all that you know...





Have you tried this one? *Flash Cards*

A guide to using flash cards

1. Flash cards work really well for subjects which requires you to learn key words e.g. science, geography, French, German, business studies etc
2. Have a stack of small cards cut up ready
3. Write the key word/phrase on one side
4. On the other side write the definition/meaning/translation etc
5. Test yourself by looking at the key word and explaining the definition-then check to see you are correct
OR read the definition and say what the key word is.
6. This is great for revising with someone at home; they can check to see you have the right answers with ease.





Have a go... flash cards vs revision cards

- Choose either flash cards or revision cards.
- Produce a set of revision resources that you can use for one topic in one subject
- **Flash cards-** For example: It could be **key words in physics** OR **words linked to holidays in German** OR **quotes for Macbeth linked to various characters or something else...**
- **Revision Cards-** For example: It could be **geography case studies in Natural Hazards** OR **summary of cells in science** OR **key elements of fitness in PE**
- Remember to finish them off at home and bring to show your tutor to be in with a chance to win the 'Going the extra mile' prize...
