AMAZING STUDENTS DOING AMAZING THINGS

STUDENT LEADERS SUPPORTING YEAR 7

It is important that your child settles quickly into our school. To ensure a smooth transition, students have had the support of our student leaders for the last few weeks. Student leaders have been involved in helping our year 7 students to navigate the school site and been a point of contact for answering questions alongside your child's tutor, head of house and wider teaching staff.

Our student leaders started planning transition initiatives, last half term with the aim of supporting pupils when they made the transition from primary to secondary. Student leaders wanted to provide all years 7 students with the opportunity to have a positive start and to develop positive relationships with peers from their year but also the wider school community.

The first initiative kicked off last week with the schools very first social mixer session. The sessions are taking place every Friday evening throughout September and are focused on socialising with new friends and meeting new people. Student leaders from across Key Stage 4 and 5 are leading these sessions with interactive games that foster new relationships. So far, we have seen more than a quarter of the year join us for speed dating and playing some primary classics like 21.

Students tell us that they are having fun, making new friends, and getting to know their new friends better. They are also loving ending the week together playing games.

If your child has not managed to join us yet there is still time to get involved as we have two sessions left (Friday 23rd and 30th September]. We meet in Armstrong house block at 3pm till 4pm.

Further transition activities and support will be starting over the future weeks during the school day, so watch out for information on social media and via your child's tutor.

I am immensely proud of the support our student leaders have given so far to our year 7 pupils, well done


and keep up the excellent drive for building positive relationships.

ATTENDANCE-A GREAT START TO THE SCHOOL YEAR

We have enjoyed a **very strong start** to the school year at Egglescliffe, with attendance at 96% over the first two weeks of the school year across Year 7-11. **Across the school, 946 students have 100% attendance so far and 1075 have an attendance of over 90%.**

The impact of attendance upon achievement cannot be overstated. In most walks of life (a school test, for example), a figure of 90% would be considered an excellent achievement. However, in attendance terms this would mean a student has missed 20 days of school and 100 separate lessons of learning. If a student has a 90% attendance record across their whole schooling from reception to Y11, they will finish their schooling having only really completed the equivalent of Year 10. This is starkly presented below:

We are blessed with fantastic support from our parents and carers which we are incredibly grateful for. There are a number of ways in which parents can help us and to help their child:

- If your child is simply too unwell to be in school, please call our school attendance line (01642 352570) before 8.30a.m. on a morning. A message can be left on the line twenty four hours a day. In this message, please tell us your child's name, year group and the presenting symptoms they have. We are unable to authorise absences when simply told that a child is ill, so any supplementary details you provide are very helpful. Please call on **each day** that your child is off. If a parent thinks that they have sent their child back to school and the school thinks the child is off, this could constitute a safeguarding concern.
- We will be making this even easier for parents by making it possible via the Parentmail app to report your child's absence. More details will follow on this.
- Medical and dental appointments: where possible, please organise these for outside of school times. If there is no option, especially for consultant appointments, if a child can come into school to get their mark first, this minimises impact. Government rules dictate that if a child does not arrive within forty minutes of the school registration cut off time, they are marked with a 'U' code, which effectively marks them as absent for the morning session.

ATTENDANCE-A GREAT START TO THE SCHOOL YEAR

- If you have a child with specific needs and they are struggling to get into school first thing, can they be brought in later in the morning or for the afternoon? Ideally, we want students to be in all day, but some of the time is always better than none of the time.
- Holidays in term time: we recognise that prices in term time are much lower than in school holidays, but we are not permitted by the Department for Education to authorise holidays and the only circumstances where this may be considered is where direct guidance is being provided by a medical practitioner or social worker. Term time holidays cost less money but the hidden costs are the impacts upon a child's learning. It is easy to think that they will catch up, but if they are missing five school days there will be twenty-five hours of gaps in their learning and this always has an impact.

All students in the school have received an assembly on the importance of attendance at school. There will be various rewards this year – both group and individual – for good attendance and for those who have made improvements where barriers have existed.

Sometimes students are just too ill, but where unsure, we ask students to consider the following question:

Will you benefit more from a day off than you would lose out from a day missed?


SIXTH FORM NEWS


WHAT'S ON IN PSHE THIS FORTNIGHT?
