Year 7 parents' evenings in the new

- **Pastoral staff and SENDCO allocate pupils to tutor groups based on:**
 - *Individual needs*
 - *Some primary school advice*
 - *Gender and academic ability split.*

- **Pastoral staff visit ALL primary schools and:**
 - *Talk to pupils about school life*
 - *Explain induction, when Y6 pupils come to experience the school*

- **SENDCO also visits Primary schools, liaising with their SENDCOs and arranges extra transition visits as necessary.**

- It MUST be in & completed by 31st October 2022 (be safe – Put it in early!!)
- Apply for up to 4 schools-you can give reasons for your preferences
- Do NOT apply for the same school 4 times – it doesn't increase your chances of a place there.

CRITERIA (In priority order)

1. Looked after children and all previously looked after children, including those children who appear (to the admission authority) to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted.
2. Pupils with a Special Education Need who are going through a statutory assessment and who have been identified as needing a 'named' mainstream school.
3. Pupils who have a brother or sister permanently living at the same address, who are still at the school when the pupil begins.
4. Pupils permanently resident i.e. the address at which the child is registered for child benefit, who expresses a preference for that school (proof of address may be required) within the admission zone who have returned a Common Application Form by the closing date - 31st October 2021.
5. Pupils with exceptional social and / or medical reasons for attending the school. A letter from the child's GP or other relevant professional such as a social worker **must be** submitted by you with the application stating why your child's needs can only be met by attending the preferred school.
6. Pupils who live closest to a particular school measured in a straight line "as the crow flies".
