### **BEHAVIOUR & REWARDS**



At the time of writing, staff have distributed over 187,000 e-praise points to students from Years 7 to 13. The overall total for last year stood at half a million(!) and so we are on course to break that which is testament to the efforts and achievements of the students – well done to you all.

'Scholarship' remains the main category for points awarding with over 60,000 given for this. However, what is especially pleasing is the sharp increase in 'teamwork' points to over 20,000 – again reflective of the togetherness of the school as a whole.

## **AMAZING STUDENTS DOING AMAZING THINGS**

#### At Egglescliffe we Choose to Succeed!

Monday 31<sup>st</sup> October saw our first whole-school 'Choose to Succeed Day'. To support the development of good revision habits, and the building of a bank of revision strategies that our students are familiar with, all students took part in revision-focussed activities in their normal timetabled lessons.

It was great to see a wide variety of tasks taking place across all curriculum areas. For example, in Science Mrs Zaranko and Mrs Severs asked their Y11 classes to 'speed-revise' in the format of speed dating, the MFL department were using the Leitner method to support students in recalling key vocabulary, Y7 students were producing revision graffiti, and in PE, students were using the dice method to practice their skills. Across all subjects, our six whole-school revision strategies were also in use: revision clocks, revision cards, mind-mapping, topic on a page, revision games and revision dice. Information about these techniques can be found on the Choose to Succeed area of the school website.

Staff were asked to put forward the best piece of work from each lesson across the day, and these students received 10 ePraise points and a letter home. The top three students (Ellie ST Y12, Millie H Y10 and James C Y9) received a £10 Amazon voucher for their efforts. Well done!

There will be two more Choose to Succeed days this academic year: Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> January and Monday 17<sup>th</sup> April.

What is a county line?

- "County Lines is a term used to describe **gangs** and organised criminal networks involved in **exporting illegal drugs** into one or more **importing areas** within the UK, using **dedicated mobile phone** lines or other form of "deal line".
- •They are likely to **exploit children** and **vulnerable adults** to move and store the drugs and money
  and they will often use coercion, intimidation,
  violence (including sexual violence) and
  weapons."



The app is totally free to download from either Apple or Google Play stores online.


