The Year 10 Rugby team won the Cleveland County Tens with wins over Dyke House, English Martyrs, High Tunstall, Sacred Heart and Hummersknott in the final. It is the third consecutive time they have won this competition.

Ben L, Richard K, Jackson P, Luke R, George S are all involved in the Durham County Pathway.

The Yr10 Rugby team also won the North East Regional League beating Whitburn, Astley High and John Spence in the final. They now progress to the last 16.

Following their first ever county tens trophy earlier in the term, the Yr11 team also did well winning the Regional Rugby League going through to the last 16 of England. They beat Whitburn in the final for the first time in 5 years. Ben H and Louie G are part of the Durham Rugby Union pathway.

ACE ADVOCATES & DYNAMIC DEFENDERS

Recently, the Egglescliffe KS4 & 5 Law Team competed at Newcastle Crown Court as part of the Bar Mock Trial competition. 8 schools and colleges from across the North East took part in prosecuting and/or defending two different cases.

In our first trial, our prosecuting team of (Advocates) Sophie H and Grace M prosecuted All Saints School in suspicion of knowingly committing unauthorised access to computer material, contrary to Section 1 of the Computer Misuse Act 1990. Presenting (witnesses) Max D and Soha K in support of the charge. Our advocates were excellent in presenting their case that the defendant did knowingly delete photographs from a University laptop without permission and the witnesses performed admirably in cross examination by the All Saints School advocates. (Court Clerk) Sophie P controlled the case professionally from the front in front of the Judge. Despite their best efforts, the jury in this case found the defendant not guilty by a majority verdict.

Our second case saw our defence team up against the eventual winners from the Keswick School. (Advocates) Ella P and Matilda S-H defended their client in the case of The King vs Rowan Hynes, in that they were charged with intentionally or recklessly causing public nuisance, in accordance with Section 78(1) of the Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Act 2022. The defence team had to convince the jury that the defendant, played by Mina O, was not involved in a protest which blocked the route to a hospital. (Usher) Olivia S was excellent in her role as well and so too was the second defence witness Niamh S who backed up the defence advocates argument that Hynes was present only in protection of their friend who was being assaulted by a member of the public. The Keswick School team delivered an excellent prosecuting argument which convinced the jury to convict the defendant on this occasion.

Round three saw our first victory in the court room. Again our defending team were on hand to unanimously defeat the prosecuting School from Consett Academy in the case of The King vs Newton, and the Computer Misuse Act 1990. The only change in the team on this occasion was the defendant was Pierce Z, who again was excellent.

Egglescliffe School finished third on the day, a fantastic effort given the extreme high quality of the competition. Good luck to Keswick School who go on to the national finals at the Royal Courts of Justice in London.

Christmas Market and is now available to purchase from Amazon. We are exceptionally proud of the 14 students that worked so hard on their stories and are now published authors!






CHOOSING TO SUCCEED AT EGGLESCLIFFE


