Touch To Twickenham Under 14 mixed Touch Rugby - Next stop Twickenham

Having won the regional round in Newcastle, the team went to the national finals at Worcester Rugby Club, where they played two matches on the stadium pitch. Schools around England were spilt into three groups of four with the top two qualifying for the cup competition and the chance to play at Twickenham and the bottom two for the plate competition.

The team came top of the group on tries scored as each school finished on two wins - City of London Freemans school, Surrey, and Fakenham, Suffolk, but lost to Trafalgar School.

SIXTH FORM UPDATE

Y12 Progression and support

UCAS launch for Y12 has taken place this term. Students have been shown each section of the application and key areas to focus on when completing these. All students are expected to have registered for a UCAS account by the end of term. Students required to sit an admissions test for UCAS have been advised to register online with Pearson VUE. For UCAT registration is open with booking available from 18th June. For all others registration opens on 1st August. Early booking is advised to ensure they can sit their assessment at a local centre. Students are also sitting mock exams, which will inform predicted grades for UCAS. These have taken place from Monday 10th June until Wednesday 26th June and results will be given directly to students, and assessments sent home to parents/carers on Monday 15th July

Y13 Leavers Event

We said farewell to our Year 13's as they completed their final exams, the last of which took place on Friday 21st June. We held a leavers assembly before study leave started where we celebrated their time with us with beautiful performances from Leia and Mary as well as over 200 shout-outs to students from staff. The tutors also nominated students who had made an exceptional contribution throughout their two years with us.





SIXTH FORM UPDATE

Cambridge STEM SMART

We are delighted to share that year 12 student, Dan H was selected to attend the residential event at Cambridge university; this phase aims to develop the deeper thinking skills needed for a strong application to, and indeed a strong start at, a good university. Throughout the first seventeen weeks of the programme, Dan has been independently working on problems on Isaac Physics with an average of 530 questions answered per participating student and over 14 hours of subject tutorials and 2 hours of small group mentoring attended. Only those students who had engaged the most strongly with the programme received an invitation. Congratulations to Dan!

Chemistry Olympiad

A group of year 13 Chemistry students competed in this year's Chemistry Olympiad run by the Royal Society of Chemistry. This is a gruelling challenge extending their knowledge and enjoyment of Chemistry above and beyond the A-level specification. The exam was sat in January and they achieved a very commendable set of results. The paper was very challenging but all the students were delighted with their results:

Claire's Law


