

Who did it? Well, that's a secret for next time. Look out for news about the next time the Drama Department performs this unmissable show.



ANNUAL CAREERS FAIR

As the growing focus on students gaining experiences beyond the classroom continues, we hosted our annual careers fair in November. Every student in the school during the day making it a very busy day with nearly 1500 students coming through the doors. This event took place in the sports hall with 60 representatives from industry, colleges and universities and the military. There were a range of activities on show to help students explore the different roles. Highlights included naming car parts with Mercedes and Nifco, an electrical wiring challenge with NG Bailey, bridge building with Arup, a VR tour of an off shore wind farm with SOFIA and the JCB simulator with Seymour Civil Engineering. This was the largest event so far with a wide range of

disciplines covered including Law, Health, Engineering, Finance, Farming, Energy, Education, Government, Automotive, Armed Services and the Police. It was great to listen to some of the conversations students had with employers about their role and how they got where they are. The purpose of events like these serve to show our students the wealth of opportunity available to them when they leave school with a mix of small, medium and global organisations right here in Teesside. Several year 10 and year 12 students were able to start the process of booking their work experiences and a couple of year 13s are now in the application phase for degree apprenticeships. With the goal of inspiring students to look at where their life can go after school, this event delivered something for everyone.

GEOGRAPHY UPDATES

It has been a richly packed term for Geography at Egglecliffe, with each year group stepping beyond the classroom to explore the world their textbooks hint at.

Our Y13 students laced up their sturdy boots with ankle protection and traced the River Leven from its upland source on Warren Moor above Kildale to (nearly) its mouth in Stokesley. This winding journey gave them a front-row seat to the rhythms of the Water and Carbon Cycle, and the chance to apply their case study knowledge to real landscapes. They gathered data, compared land-uses, and left with very muddy boots but hopefully and cleaner insight into the processes shaping this local scale river system.

Meanwhile, Y11 headed north to Newcastle for an immersive tour of their Urban Issues and Challenges case studies. They explored everything from urban greening along the Ouseburn, to the expanding edges of Newcastle Great Park, to the cultural energy of Chinatown and the Quayside. Themes such as urban sprawl, the impact of migration, regeneration projects, and the opportunities and challenges of a growing city all came to life around them. Seeing these topics in situ gave students a stronger sense of how cities evolve, stretch, struggle and adapt.

Y12 enjoyed something especially memorable: a personalised visit to the Geography Department at Durham University, exclusively for Egglecliffe. Students explored cutting-edge facilities, discovered just how wide geography-related careers can reach, and even handled equipment with price tags that could make your eyes widen (some single items worth around £450,000, and not even the largest machines in the room). They also heard about the excellent academic and well-being support available at Durham, and chatted with current undergraduate geographers who shared what studying the subject feels like day to day.

Across all three trips, students represented the school brilliantly. Their curiosity, teamwork and enthusiasm made each visit a highlight of the term and strengthened the real-world foundations of their learning.

SENIOR MATHS CHALLENGE SUCCESS!

After a five year hiatus, the regional UKMT Team Challenges have begun again, starting with the Senior Team Maths Challenge in which a group of four Y12s and Y13s tackle a series of 'thinking outside the box' maths problems. After many successful practice rounds where the students had given up their lunchtimes, the team travelled to Durham Sixth Form College at the end of November to battle against other teams from across the North East to determine who would become the regional champions!

Picked due to their high scores on the individual maths challenge, Pierce and Joe represented the college from Y12 and Noah and Tom were selected from Y13. Three of these students additionally took part in the second round of the Individual Maths Challenge (known as the Kangaroo Challenge), and all achieved highly - Noah in particular did well and earned himself a Gold Certificate!

The quartet did not let themselves down on the day. Their teamwork and camaraderie was clearly evident, and the students played off each other's strengths very well. Throughout the whole competition, the team only got 2 questions wrong and only dropped a few more points by barely missing out on a time-based bonus 3 point question set. Even though they finished with an incredible 170/180 points, this score was only good enough for second place, but still an incredible achievement given the quality of the opposition (many of which were private schools).

In previous years, this score would have been good enough to win but alas not on this day! Also in previous years, the highest scoring second place teams are invited to the National Finals (this year to be held in Manchester), and so we await with baited breath whether or not the team have done enough to qualify for this next round. Even if they don't make it through, this performance alone was truly awesome and all students have been praised highly - well done, you've done us proud!





The voucher is then **exchanged at the foodbank for a food parcel**.


